Protect your SNAP benefits from illegal card skimmers

With SNAP benefits, you use an EBT card to buy food at the store. But we're hearing about scammers using illegal skimmers to steal card information, then grabbing your benefits for themselves. Here's how to spot and avoid these scams.

Scammers sneak illegal card skimmers onto payment terminals in stores, so they can grab data from your card's magnetic stripe. All without you knowing a thing. Since EBT cards require PINs, scammers find ways to get those codes: they might try to <u>phish</u> you, using texts or calls to get you to share your PIN, or set up hidden cameras by the card skimmers to record you entering your code.

Once they have your information, the scammers create duplicate cards and drain your benefits. They can even find out how much is stored in your account by calling the state's benefit hotline. Even worse, you probably won't know what's happened until you're at a register with a cart full of groceries and find your card nearly (or totally) empty.

Here are some ways to avoid these scams:

- **Spot card skimmers**. Before you swipe your EBT or any card, pay attention to the card reader. Is it loose, off-center, or do parts of it wiggle? Then don't put your card there. Report it to the store manager and consider shopping elsewhere.
- Change your PIN often. Change your EBT PIN at least once a month, right before you get your next benefits.
- Watch for phishing. State agencies and EBT processors will never call or text you to ask for your PIN or card number. Anyone who does is a scammer.
- Check your EBT account regularly for unauthorized charges. If you see any, change your PIN right away to stop the thief from making new purchases — and contact your local SNAP office.

However, for the SNAP scam to happen, the store manager MUST be in cohoot with the scammers to allow the skimmer to be installed, even cameras. Large store like Walmart won't allow anyone to install cameras to extract the PIN code. These issues happen in mini grocery store where the store clerk ONLY makes 7 dollars per hour and the scammers pay him 400 dollars additional weekly if they allow the skimmer to stick to the card reader. They got me, on June 1st at 6:55pm...just filed a police report with Gwinnett County Police Dept. Officer said it sounded to him like they skimmed my EBT card. This probably happened at a WalMart in New Orleans. The thieves then made a duplicate card and used it at a MetroChef store in Gwinnett County, Georgia, where they drained my entire foodstamp balance of \$276.26 -- but left three cents on the account. Wasn't that nice of them? I called the store manager and he was very cooperative, said he has video of the suspect transaction and will provide it to the police when they come. Turns out the thieves fabricate new cards with new magnetic strips on the back, then get the PIN from the skimmer they used.
